- Horse Donation All of our four-legged therapists come from various background –
 family ponies, dressage, trail companion, race track, etc. Prospective new horse must
 be sound with no vices. They must be under 25 years of age and no more than 16.0
 hands. An instructor will visit the horse that is offered for donation. The prospective
 horse will be ridden independently and with a lead line, testing his "bomb proof" ability
 and suitability for our program. Once approved horses come to the stable for a
 minimum of two-week trial period. The owner receives a Donation Agreement when
 the horse is moved to the stable.
